from a Ukrainian family that fled the war in Ukraine. The family ended up here in Yonkers and now needs to find permanent housing, help with English as a second language and help with finding work. This family did not qualify for our housing but because so many people in the affordable housing and non-profit world know each other I was able to introduce this family to an organization called Hearts and Homes, which could help them. I am thankful for the connections I have made outside of the "MHACY family" that can aid people in need.

I am also thankful for the connections I have made inside the MHACY family. Whether it's a baby shower for a MHACY staff member, a discussion with a staff member about their elderly dog, working with property management staff to get City of Yonkers repairs made at Palisade Towers or raising money for Relay for Life through the staff Potluck, I am always amazed, humbled and gratified by the kindness, dedication and patience the MHACY staff exhibit towards each other, towards our tenants and towards the greater community.

Trying to help someone find housing can be hard, especially when you have thousands of people who are also calling or e-mailing and asking for your help. The housing need is great and the list of things to do is never ending. People call or write to me on weekends and even in the middle of the night. It's whenever they can grab the time. For some reason, this month has been particularly busy in that regard. It could become overwhelming. But there are a million things to be thankful for that help me fight that feeling. 
Poster Contest Winners Rewarded for Their Talents




